The Nēnē (Hawaiian Goose) loves to eat grass and berries in the wild. In our hospital it gets colorful salads made with greens, sprouts, different types of berries, papaya, corn, peas, and cherry tomatoes.

The 'Ā (Masked Booby) spends a lot of time over the ocean, which means seafood is on the menu. It loves to eat fish and squid!

The Kölea (Pacific Golden-Plover) flies nonstop to Hawai'i from Alaska. When it arrives, it needs to eat food high in calories to replenish the energy it took to make the long trip. What's fat, juicy and wrigaly? Bugs!
