HELP NATİVE SEABİRDS SURVİVE FALLOUT

Each year young seabirds fledge from their nest for the first time and use moonlight to navigate their way out to sea. During this time, they can become confused and driven off-course by urban lights from airports, street lamps, buildings, and homes. They may sustain injuries and, once on the ground, are vulnerable to many different dangers.

If you find a downed seabird, quick response is critical.
Please place the bird in a ventilated box and deliver to an
approved drop-off location as soon as you can. Do not
provide food or water or attempt to release the bird.

How do you know if you found a downed seabird? There are two key features to look for:





Webbed feet



Tube nostrils
